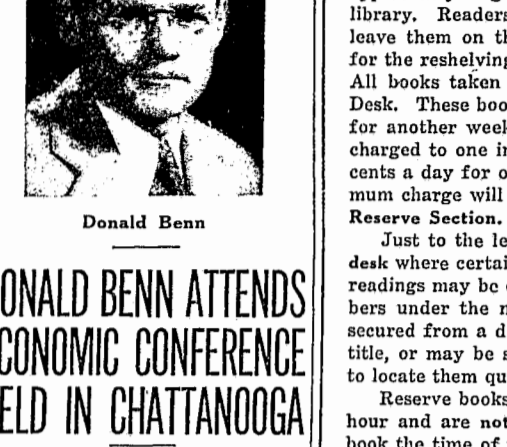

Honor Council Urged To Study Football Possibilities

Twenty-eight Heard From Wednesday's chapel resounded with ringing opinions as the student body of S. P. J. C. held open forum, ending with a unanimous vote in favor of a committee to study the possibility of the inclusion of intercollegiate football in its sport schedule.

While discussion centered about the question of a football team many other "hot" topics were presented.

Lou Harrod from the first espoused the formation of a college football team, saying "This question of football is of greatest interest to all of us. We have a number of colleges in this state and we could be having a very profitable season with these colleges. I feel that we all approve and desire intercollegiate football. We could have a football team and since a number of us are interested in football are coming back here next year we naturally desire to begin to talk it up. It would be something very valuable to our college."

Support for the suggestion was indicated by Kelley Abbott, John Lewis, Maurice Hanks, and Jimmy Phillips, who presided over the meeting.
